Dr. Tsukiboshi is a graduate of Osaka University School of Dentistry in 1976. He earned a PhD in dental materials from Kyoto University in 1980 and has been engaged in private practice since 1981. Dr. Tsukiboshi's interest in dental traumatology and autotransplantation has led to extensive clinical involvement, course presentations and publications. Dr. Tsukiboshi has lectured extensively on dental trauma and autotransplantation; he has authored many articles and two textbooks, one on dental trauma in 1998 and one on autotransplantation in 2000. The books have been published in several languages, including English. Dr. Tsukiboshi is a visiting lecturer at Osaka University and Loma Linda University since 1998 and is the President of the International Association of Dental Traumatology in 2009 and 2010.

AUTOTRANSPLANTATION OF TEETH IN YOUNG PATIENTS

Words associated with transplantation of teeth are 'pessimism and tragedy' for some dentists but 'hope and pleasure' for the others. The difference stems from different experiences of the dentists themselves or biases of teachers and peers with whom they have discussed the procedure. If the clinical and experimental studies on transplantation over the last 30 years are considered, hope should replace pessimism with regard to this procedure. The success/survival rate of transplant can be higher in the younger patients, the indications of whom have some advantages over implant.

In the presentation, the brief history of transplantation, wound healing, indications and techniques for success, long term follow-up results will be discussed. If time permits, surgical extrusion and intentional replantation of endodontically compromised teeth in young patients will be covered, too. The lecture will be extensively illustrated with many clinical cases.

DENTAL TRAUMATOLOGY FOR CHILDREN & ADOLESCENTS

In spite of the high prevalence of dental trauma, there seems to be a lack of treatment protocol uniformly agreed in the world of dentistry. Dental trauma is an acute disease involving the hard tissues, the pulp, and or the periodontium, and is more frequently seen in young people. Since infection is seldom associated with traumatized teeth, treatment options can be conservative. In other words, in dental trauma, pulpotomy is preferred over pulpectomy, simple composite restorations over complex prosthetics, and replantation over extraction. The concept of "minimal intervention" should be upheld when treating traumatized teeth. In the presentation, treatment planning for various traumatized teeth such as crown fractures, crown-root fracture, root fractures, subluxation, intrusion and avulsion will be presented with the MI concept.
